

Orange Tree Class - Spring Term



Creative Arts

In cooking, pupils will learn to group familiar food products e.g. fruit and vegetables and cut ingredients safely.

In Art and design, they will experiment with printing and learn how to fold, tear and cut paper and card.

In music, all pupils follow the Leicestershire Music Hub modules looking at pulse, voice and rhythm, making movements to music and learning songs and actions.

Mathematics

At Woodfield we follow the White Rose Mathematics scheme. In the Spring Term, pupils will focus on cementing their practice and understanding of multiplication and division, length and height. There will be opportunities to learn through doing, using objects, songs and rhymes. The term will move on to mass, capacity and temperature and money.

Science

Pupils will learn about and explore different materials such as wood, plastic, glass, metal, etc. Learning will come through modelling, play and practice. Pupils will also engage in some of their own experiments, learning to work with others and follow a method.

Humanities

In History, pupils will study people in our community, explore different jobs, and learn how individuals and teams contribute to community life.

In Geography, pupils will use the Kapow resource to complete the module Around the World.

English

For Orange Tree, English will focus on securing familiarity with letters and sounds, using games and repetition of the alphabet. They will practice blending sounds, and letter recognition.

Bug Club Phonics will be used daily, and pupils will engage in reading aloud with an adult.

The year will be framed around storytelling and will focus on fairytales, in the Spring Term: The Three Little Pigs and The Gingerbread man.

PE/sports

Orange Tree will engage in daily physical activity to get their bodies awake and ready to learn. In multi-skills, they will start with running and jumping. They will look at jumping jacks and circuit training in Gymnastics and explore yoga. PE will focus on building confidence and coordination, supporting them to recognise the importance of keeping healthy. In good weather, Orange Tree will go to the local park to learn how to swing and take turns on the slide.

PSHE

Pupils are following the Jigsaw PSHE program and will learn about Dreams and Goals. They will look at setting a goal, facing challenges and never giving up. Healthy Me begins in February where pupils will learn to eat healthy food and live active and healthy lifestyle and keep clean and safe.
